**Allocation of Fleets and Schedule of Races for:
The Qualifying Series and Flight Selection Series**

1.0 Monday, August 10, 2009: Qualifying Series

- 1.1. INSA will divide all non-prequalified skippers into five (5) flights, each flight designated by a color (Black, Blue, Red, White, and Yellow). The list showing each boats' flight and color will be posted at the end of the Skippers' Meeting on Monday, 10 August 2009.
- 1.2. Flight Ribbons will be distributed after the Skippers' Meeting. All ribbons must be attached to the outboard end of the boats boom and be easily visible.
- 1.3. There will be a meeting for Coaches intending to be on the water during the regatta after the Skippers' Meeting at a site to be announced at the Skippers' Meeting.
- 1.4. There will be five (5) races with two starts each. Each set of races is scheduled to run consecutively with limited delays. Each skipper racing in the next start should proceed to the starting area immediately after all finishing obligations are complete. There will be no formal lunch break. Skippers should eat prior to racing, or during their bye race.
- 1.5. Order of starts – Qualifying Series – Monday, 10 August 2009:

- 1.6. At the end of racing on Monday all competitors will return colored ribbons to the registration desk.
- 1.7. If for any reason the Qualifying Series cannot be completed on Monday, August 10, 2009, races necessary to complete the Series may take place on Tuesday August 11, 2009, and/or Wednesday August 12, 2009 and/or Thursday August 13, 2009.

2.0 Tuesday, August 11, 2009: Flight Selection Series

- 2.1. INSA will divide all prequalified skippers and add the top finishing skippers from the Qualifying Series up to a total of 140 competitors (plus ties) into five (5) fleets, each fleet designated by a color (Black, Blue, Red, White, and Yellow). The list showing each boats' flight and color will be posted at the end of the Skippers' Meeting on Tuesday, 11 August 2009.
- 2.2. Flight Ribbons will be distributed after the Skippers' Meeting. All ribbons must be attached to the outboard end of the boats boom and be easily visible. Ribbons from the Qualifying Series must be removed.
- 2.3. There will be a meeting of Coaches intending to be on the water during the regatta after the Skippers' meeting at a site to be announced at the Skippers' Meeting.
- 2.4. There will be five (5) races with two starts each. Each set of races is scheduled to run consecutively with limited delays. Each skipper racing in the next start should proceed to the starting area immediately after all finishing obligations are complete. There will be no formal lunch break. Skippers should eat prior to racing, or during their bye race.

3.0 Wednesday, August 12, 2009: Championship Regatta

3.1 The regatta will divide into 4 groups according to the results of the Flight Selection Series. The first thirty-five (plus any ties for thirty-fifth) will be placed in the Championship Fleet (GOLD). The next 35 (plus ties) will be placed in the SILVER Fleet. The next 35 (plus ties) will be placed in the BRONZE fleet, and all others will be placed in the IRON fleet. The list showing the divisions will be posted by the completion of the Skippers' Meeting on Wednesday.

3.2 Flight Ribbons will be distributed after the Skippers' Meeting. All ribbons must be attached to the outboard end of the boats boom and be easily visible. Ribbons from the Qualifying Series must be removed.

3.3 There will be a meeting of Coaches intending to be on the water during the regatta after the skippers' meeting at a site to be announced at the Skippers' Meeting.

3.4 Four races are scheduled fo reach fleet with a very short lunch break after the second race. The warning for the first race will be at 1100. The SILVER fleet start will immediately follow the GOLD start. The BRONZE fleet will receive a new warning signal a few minutes later. An effort will be made to time this start so that the BRONZE fleet will start shortly after the SILVER fleet rounds the leeward mark the last time. The IRON fleet start will immediately follow the BRONZE start.
