NOTICE OF RACE

PLEASE NOTE: ABYC recommends that all competitors wear personal flotation devices while on the water. The Y flag (personal flotation required) will be flown at all regattas from October 15 through April 14, and it may be flown at other regattas.

RULES: This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing. The timing sequence of rule 26 will be changed. The changes will appear in the sailing instructions. A painter suitable for towing at least one (1) boat length long is required. The organizing authorities are the Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA) and Alamitos Bay Yacht Club (ABYC).

ELIGIBILITY: The regatta is open to any class of small sailboat, monohull or multihull, not exceeding twenty feet (20') in overall length and not having a fixed keel, owned or under charter to a member of a yacht club "in good standing" with SCYA, to members of United States Sailing Association-affiliated yacht clubs if they reside outside the SCYA area and to sailors who do not reside in the United States but are members of their respective National Governing Authorities.

CLASSES: Boats will sail on both Ocean and Bay Courses. Classes sailing on the Ocean Course would include 5-0-5, A Class cats, CFJ (spinnaker), F-18 cats, Laser and Snipe. Classes sailing on the Bay Course would include Lido 14 and Naples Sabot.

Each one-design class will sail in a single, combined fleet except for Naples Sabot Junior "C" sailors as defined by the International Naples Sabot Association (INSA): a separate fleet for Naples Sabot Junior "C" sailors will be established and will be raced and scored separately from the rest of the Naples Sabot class.

SCHEDULE: Six (6) races are scheduled, with no more than four (4) races to be sailed on any one day. The first warning signal each day will be at 1155.

ENTRIES: Eligible boats may enter online or in person. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED VIA MAIL OR FAX. Online entries will be accepted until 1600 on the Friday immediately preceding the regatta; thereafter entries may only be made in person. In-person entries will be accepted until 0930 for Ocean Classes and 1000 for Bay Classes on regatta morning.

COMPETITORS' MEETING: Competitors' meetings will be held on the ABYC patio on Saturday at 1000 for Ocean Classes and 1030 for Bay Classes.

SUPPORT BOATS: All support boats, including coach and spectator boats, shall register with the race committee and shall attend a meeting following the competitors' meeting.

SCORING: When fewer than five (5) races are completed, a boat's score will be the total of her scores. Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

TROPHIES: Trophies will be awarded according to the following schedule: five (5) boats entered = one (1) trophy awarded; six (6) to eight (8) = two (2); nine (9) to 11 = three (3); 12-14 = four (4); 15 or more = five (5). The E.E. MANNING CUP will be awarded to the winner of the fleet with the largest number of competitors. The SKIMMER TROPHY will be awarded to the winner of the fleet with the second largest number of competitors. The KOBER PERPETUAL TROPHY will be awarded to the winner of the Naples Sabot fleet. The HOST CLUB TROPHY will be awarded at the discretion of the race committee to the most deserving junior sailor.

ARBITRATION: All protests involving rules of Part 2 will first be submitted to arbitration. The arbitration procedure will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board as an addendum to the sailing instructions.

LAUNCHING: Two hoists and a launching ramp are available. Every boat using a hoist must have it's own INTERNAL sling.

PARKING AND STORAGE: Due to space limitations, parking on ABYC grounds is restricted. Off-street parking is available across the street in municipal lots. Participants should obtain passes from the ABYC office. Participants may bring their boats into the ABYC yard on the Friday before the regatta between 0900 and 1700. Extended storage on a space-available basis may be requested IN ADVANCE by contacting the ABYC office. **NOTE:** ABYC is closed on Monday and Tuesday except for card-key access to the grounds.

HOSPITALITY: The hospitality of ABYC is extended to all participants. The ABYC Galley will be open from 0900 to 1630. Breakfast is served from 0900 from 1030. Lunches (including bag lunches), snacks, soft drinks and beer will be available. A club bar will be open after racing each day.

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authorities will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
