NOTICE OF RACE

The Organizing Authority will be the Alamitos Bay Yacht Club, Long Beach, CA

1. RULES

- 1.1. This regatta will be governed by the "rules" as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The timing sequence of rule 26 will be changed. The changes will appear in the Sailing Instructions.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. This regatta is open to members' "in good standing" of an SCYA affiliated yacht club, to members of US SAILING Association-affiliated yacht clubs if they reside outside the SCYA area, and to foreign sailors who are members of their respective National Governing Authorities.
- 2.2. Bay Course classes include: Naples Sabot (Ladies A, Ladies B, Gentleman)

3. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 3.1. Three (3) races are scheduled.
- 3.2. The Warning Signal for the first race each day will be at 1155.

4. ENTRIES AND FEES

Eligible boats may enter online or in person. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED VIA MAIL OR FAX. Online entries will be accepted until 1600 on the Friday immediately preceding the regatta; thereafter entries may only be made in person. In-person entries will be accepted 1000 for Bay Classes on regatta morning.

5. COMPETITORS' MEETINGS

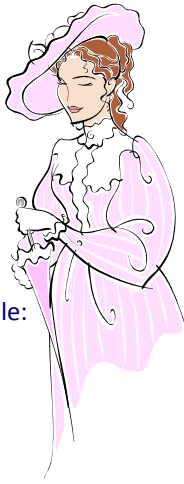
Competitors' meetings will be held on the ABYC patio on Saturday at 1030.

6. SUPPORT BOATS

All support boats, including coach and spectator boats, must check in at registration prior to the competitors' briefing and shall meet with a race official immediately following the competitors' meeting.

7. SCORING

- 7.1. When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 7.2. One (1) race constitutes a series.

8. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to the following schedule:

Five (5) boats	One (1) trophy;
Six (6) to eight (8)	Two (2) trophies;
Nine (9) to 11	Three (3) trophies;
12 to 14	Four (4) trophies;
15 or more	Five (5) trophies.

The following perpetual trophies will be awarded:

Ruth M. Russell	Awarded to any woman skipper with the best performance.
Lindsay Wagner	Awarded to the highest placing ABYC women member in the most competitive fleet.

9. PARKING AND BOAT STORAGE

- 9.1. Due to space limitations, vehicle parking on ABYC grounds is restricted. Off-street parking is available across the street in municipal lots. Participants should obtain vehicle parking passes from the ABYC office.
- 9.2. The Regatta fee includes launching, recovery, and storage for visiting competing boats from the day prior to the event until the day following the event. If the event ends on a Sunday, this period is extended to the next day the club is open, as ABYC is closed on Monday and Tuesday.
- 9.3. Visiting competing boats may request extended storage IN ADVANCE by contacting the ABYC office. The cost is \$10.00 per day paid in advance.
- 9.4. Any boat or trailer found on ABYC property without prior written authorization from ABYC is subject to impound and associated fees.

10. HOSPITALITY

- 10.1. The hospitality of ABYC is extended to all participants.
- 10.2. The Galley will be open each day. Regatta Breakfast menu and bag lunches will be available.
- 10.3. The club bar will be open after racing.
- 10.4. Dinner will be served during the trophy presentation at approximately 17:00. **One dinner ticket** is included with your entry. The price for additional tickets will be \$10. Please make reservations for additional dinners with the **ABYC Office: (562) 434-9955**.

11. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authorities will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

12. SAFETY

ABYC recommends that all competitors wear personal flotation devices while on the water. The Y flag (personal flotation required) will be flown at all regattas from October 15 through April 14, and it may be flown at other regattas.
