NOTICE OF RACE

The Organizing Authority will be the Alamitos Bay Yacht Club, Long Beach, CA.

1. RULES

- 1.1. This regatta will be governed by the "rules" as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The timing sequence of rule 26 will be changed. The changes will appear in the Sailing Instructions.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. This regatta is open to members' "in good standing" of an SCYA affiliated yacht club, to members of US SAILING Association-affiliated yacht clubs if they reside outside the SCYA area, and to foreign sailors who are members of their respective National Governing Authorities.
- 2.2. **Classes:** The regatta is open to any class of small sailboat, monohull or multihull, not exceeding twenty feet (20') in overall length and not having a fixed keel
 - a) **Ocean Course** classes include: , 5-0-5, A-Cat, CFJ, C-15, Finn, Formula 18 cats, Hobie 16, I-14, I-420, Laser Full Rig, Laser Radial, Portsmouth (monohull and multihull), Snipe, Thistle.
 - b) **Bay Course** classes include: Lido 14 and Naples Sabot (Senior, Junior A, B, C1, C2, C3.)
- 2.3. Each one-design class will sail in a single, combined fleet except for Naples Sabot Junior "C" sailors as defined by the International Naples Sabot Association (INSA): a separate fleet for Naples Sabot Junior "C" sailors will be established and will be raced and scored separately from the rest of the Naples Sabot class.
 - a) For the sole purpose of the Advancement Guidelines ("Move Up") under ARTICLE IV of the INSA class rules, Naples Sabot (A, B, C1, C2, C3, Sr) classifications will sail in their respective combined fleets but be scored separately using the points for their finish position relative to boats in their classification as their score for that race. No trophies will be awarded for the winners of the individual classifications.

3. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 3.1. Seven (7) races are scheduled, with no more than four (4) races to be sailed on any one day.
- 3.2. The Starting Signal for the first race each day will be at 1200.

4. ENTRIES AND FEES

- 4.1. Five (5) PAID entries are required to establish a class. Entry fees are as follows:

- 4.2. Eligible boats may enter online or in person. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED VIA MAIL OR FAX. Online entries will be accepted until 1600 on the Friday immediately preceding the regatta; thereafter entries may only be made in person. In-person entries will be accepted until 0930 for Ocean Classes and 1000 for Bay Classes on regatta morning.

5. COMPETITORS' MEETINGS

- 5.1. Competitors' meetings will be held on the ABYC patio on Saturday at 1000 for Ocean Classes and 1030 for Bay

Classes.

6. SUPPORT BOATS

6.1. All support boats, including coach and spectator boats, must check in at registration prior to the competitors' briefing and shall meet with a race official immediately following the competitors' meeting.

7. SCORING

7.1. When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

7.2. One (1) race constitutes a series.

8. TROPHIES

8.1. Trophies will be awarded to the following schedule:

- a) Five (5) boats – One (1) trophy;
- b) Six (6) to eight (8) – Two (2) trophies;
- c) Nine (9) to 11 – Three (3) trophies;
- d) 12 to 14 – Four (4) trophies;
- e) 15 or more – Five (5) trophies.

8.2. The following perpetual trophies will be awarded:

- a) Largest Class – E.E. Manning Perpetual Trophy.
- b) Second Largest Class – Skimmer Trophy.
- c) Naples Sabot – Kober Perpetual Trophy.
- d) Most Deserving Individual – Host Club Trophy.

9. ARBITRATION

9.1. All protests involving rules of Part 2 or Rule 31 will first be submitted to arbitration. The arbitration procedure will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board as an addendum to the Sailing Instructions.

10. LAUNCHING

10.1. Two hoists (maximum capacity 5,000 lbs.) and a dinghy ramp are available. Every boat using a hoist must have its own INTERNAL sling.

11. PARKING AND STORAGE

11.1. Due to space limitations, vehicle parking on ABYC grounds is restricted. Off-street parking is available across the street in municipal lots. Participants should obtain vehicle parking passes from the ABYC office.

11.2. The Regatta fee includes launching, recovery, and storage for visiting competing boats from the day prior to the event until the day following the event. If the event ends on a Sunday, this period is extended to the next day the club is open, as ABYC is closed on Monday and Tuesday.

11.3. Visiting competing boats may request extended storage IN ADVANCE by contacting the ABYC office. The cost is \$10.00 per day paid in advance.

11.4. Any boat or trailer found on ABYC property without prior written authorization from ABYC is subject to impound and associated fees.

12. HOSPITALITY

12.1. The hospitality of ABYC is extended to all participants. The ABYC Galley will be open from 0900 to 1630. Breakfast is served from 0900 from 1030. Lunches (including bag lunches), snacks, soft drinks and beer will be available. A club bar will be open after racing each day.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

13.1. Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authorities will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

14. SAFETY

14.1. ABYC recommends that all competitors wear personal flotation devices while on the water. The Y flag (personal

flotation required) will be flown at all regattas from October 15 through April 14, and it may be flown at other regattas.
